
# COMPUTER LOGGING FOR CONTESTING, DX OR GENERAL LOGGING



#### WHY USE COMPUTER LOGGING?

- \* utilizes available online or stored features
  - > Clusters
  - > Score reporting
  - > Reverse beaconing (reporting your signal strength world wide)
- \* ability to log QSO's at a fast rate
- logging accuracy
- networking (including distributed multi-op setups)
- uploading logs to contest websites
- the ability to use stored commands (CW/RTTY Macros or Wav files for SSB)
- \* ability to control the radio

### computer logging programs

There are many programs available some are free and some have a price.

I mainly use N1MM logger+ which is free and very well supported.

I also use N3FJP Amateur log which has a price of \$39.00 USD.

The POTA site has setup instructions for N3FJP

#### ❖ N1MM LOGGER+

- > controls the radios
- > has networking ability
- > for use in multi/multi contests
- > wide variety of contests
- interfaces with clusters and contest reporting sites
- > creates files needed for contest submissions
- provides multiplier calculation and dupe checking
- > stores country list (CTY)
- > call history files and more...

#### N1MM Logger+

The most widely used logging program in North America

Has contests configurations available for many contests.

Has a feature to allow for "user defined contests" such as POTA

Can be used for general logging

#### Used in North America

- not so much in Europe whereWintest is the logger of choice
- ➤ the list of contest is extensive and have not found a contest that is not provided for
- ➤ user defined contests allow programming by individuals. There are instructions provided for this
- ➤ N1MM+ general logging works well but I find N3FJP to be better



Let's take a look at the N1MM logger + program – this program is free and very well supported. Very oriented to contesting. Full list of contest are available



Let's take a look at the N3FJP logging program – there is a cost for the program \$39.00 USD. More oriented to specialty logs such as Net Logging, Amateur exam study, Morse code teacher, Club score processor, WX weather warning program etc,. CQ and other contests are included.

#### **USAGE & WRAP UP**

- **❖** Touch typing is helpful but not necessary
- **❖** Handles a large number of QSO's
- **\*** Tracks dupes and computes your score
- **Provides** access to the contest websites for log uploading
- **❖** Provides computer networking for Muti/Multi contest operation
  - > This includes distributed Multi op contest entries
- **Logs** can be stored by date and contest for future reference
- **Logs easily uploaded to LOTW, QRZ, Club Log or other sites.**

#### DISTRIBUTED MULTI OPERATION

- **\*** stations networked together using the internet
- **❖** one networking program that I have used is "LOGMEIN"
- **\*** we have networked 4 stations located in Surrey, Vancouver and North Vancouver during COVID.
- **❖** N1MM+ is particularly suited for this configuration as it allows for seamless setup
- \* now that COVID is history not all contest accept distributed multi-op logs. If considering this configuration you need to check the contest rules closely.
- \* there are no geographic restrictions that I am aware of.
